I'd like to thank the dozen or so ladies who helped us to test out the new Golf Genius electronic sign-up system this past summer. You'll hear more about this from Smitty, but by using the GG app (easy to download for free from the Apple Store or Play Store) it will save a lot of last-minute computer entries. Also, having one person keeping score per group will make getting results all that much faster and again, a lot less time at the computer for our Pro and his staff. The game identification (GGID) will

be provided a week in advance each week by email (at least once (a)). There will continue to be a paper sign-up in the locker room, but we are STRONGLY encouraging everyone to go digital and use the Golf Genius

app.

In addition to our regular Tuesday gatherings we'll be joining the MGA for five Saturday Breakfast Scrambles (breakfast optional). The first will be Saturday Dec. 16th. These will be 4 person teams so put on your thinking caps. In November we'll have our

#### LGA/MGA Mixer 2 Day event.

## **LGA Spirit Award**

The LGA Spirit Award is open to all current LGA members regardless of handicap index. Points toward the award (detailed in the LGA Handbook) will be awarded to every golfer for placing in the Tuesday Ladies Day matches (net scores). When scramble games are played, each player on the team is awarded points in all flights. Individual scores such as best ball games will also be awarded for all flights. Everyone who participates each week earns at least 1 or 2 points. (This is one time where participation awards are appreciated (a))

The Pro Shop maintains the running totals through our last regular Tuesday in March 2024 and the running total is posted on the LGA board outside the pro shop. The winner will be announced at the LGA General Meeting in April.

The member with the highest number of points wins a personalized Sunrise Country Club golf bag. Past winners include Ann Noeggerath, Brenda Thuringer and Jeanne Bihm. Winners cannot win again for three years so that gives time for their bag to wear a little before earning a new one and the rest of us the opportunity to win the Spirit Award.

### Handicap Chair, Diane Brocco

Remember when, after a round of golf, we had to post our scores on an old computer or kiosk tucked away in a dark corner or, worse yet, in the bathroom of the proshop? In 2020, the new USGA GHIN app for our phones made the kiosk a thing of the past. The app has quickly become the score-posting device of choice. After each hole just enter your score in the app like you would on the scorecard. Maintaining a Handicap Index isn't just useful for more experienced players. It's for everyone.

Every year since its arrival on the scene, the USGA GHIN app has added new and cool features, based on feedback from golfers, clubs, and other golf associations. GPS was the first feature added. The app provides distances to the center of the green and touchpoint distances to anywhere on the course. Just like having a trusty caddie, knowing the accurate yardages for your next shot gives all of us, regardless of playing ability, more confidence and

better chance at success. However, the feature I like the best, is, once my round is over, to just hit the post button and I'm done. This is the simplest way to keep my handicap up-to-date.

There are two options of the app available. The GPS version is free, armed with thousands of course maps. For free, I'd recommend using it for the convenience alone. However if you are like me, you want all the information you can get to help better your game. The upgraded version has an annual subscription cost of \$49.99. Some of the upgrades I use are the Apple smartwatch application, stat-tracking, and reports. I have found the reports showing percentages and bar graphs to be the most helpful. Try it out!

And no matter what tool you use, from Apple watch to good old paper scorecard, don't forget to post your score after every round.

#### Rule of the Month...Ball Out of Bounds

<u>Ball out of Bounds (USGA Rule 18)</u> If you hit your ball out of bounds you must hit another ball from the same spot. If you are in the tee box you can tee up another ball. If you are not on the tee box take a drop within one club length (no nearer the hole) of your previous stroke. There is a one stroke penalty for a lost or out of bounds ball.

The Provisional Ball.(USGA Rule 18.3) It is best to play a provisional ball if you think your original ball is out of bounds or lost. This saves time and ensures that the pace of the game will continue. You must an-

nounce that you are playing a provisional ball. If you discover that your original ball is not out of bounds nor lost, you must continue to play with it and pick up the provisional ball – with no penalty.

If your original ball has landed in a Penalty Area, you cannot play a provisional ball but instead must proceed with the Penalty Area rule. (USGA Rule 17).

An excellent tool to have handy is the USGA Rules of Golf app. It is easy to navigate and can really help you on the course if there is confusion about a rule.

The LGA had decided to add online registration for LGA Events. We will still keep the signup sheet in the Ladies Locker Room for those who wish to use that method and players can also signup these two ways as well:

Download the Golf Genius app to your phone. Once downloaded to your phone, you will enter the GGID (this is tournament ID in Golf Genius software) where it says GGID. Once you have logged in, go to MEMBER PORTAL, then click on REGISTRATION. Once registration is completed, you will receive confirmation email to let you know you have registered. The email with the GGID will go out the Tuesday before the event after the LGA Shotgun has begun.

Go to golfgenius.com and enter the GCID in the space marked GGID. Once entered, at the home page for the event, go above and click on REGISTRATION. Once REGISTRATION is finalized, you will receive a confirmation email to let you know that you have registered for the event.

If anyone has any questions, let the Golf Shop know as well.

Rule 9.k.3 — If a tree is between the ball and the hole, and the tree is deemed to be younger than the player, then the ball can be moved without penalty. This is so because this is simply a question of timing; when the player was younger, the tree was not there so the player is being penalized because of his age.
