ARE YOU A GOLF GENIUS?

The Sunrise Country Club is now using Golf Genius for all women's golf events and regular play on Tuesdays. We will keep the paper sign up in the women's locker room but it is our hope that by the end of the season, we will all be Geniuses. Here are some tips to signing up with Golf Genius:

FIRST: Each week, Smitty will send out the GGID password for the following Tuesday. That is your password to get into this week's game.

On your computer or iPad, go to www.golfgenius.com. In the upper right hand corner is the SIGN IN block. Click on that block and it will take you to a screen that asks for the GGID. That's where you enter the GGID that Smitty has sent out for the week's play. Follow the prompts to register for the "event".

OR

Download the golf genius app to your iPhone or Android device. Once the app is installed, click on GGID and enter the GGID for the week's play.

Once you are in the GGID screen. Go to MEMBER PORTAL. Select PLAYER REGISTRATION (unless it is a team event). Select NEW REGISTRATION. Enter the 1st 3 letters of your last name. Complete the EVENT REGISTRATION online form (it should be filled out for you)

The information for the upcoming week's game will be preloaded. So basically all you have to do is tell Golf Genius that you will be participating. You can also poke around the site and learn who is already signed up to play.

See? We can all become Geniuses!!!

6 Simple Golf Rules to Know

It's down to us, the player, in the spirt of the game to play by the rules of golf. To do so, here are Six Basic Rules to know and use in your everyday round of golf.

1.Clubs

The maximum number of clubs you can carry is 14, with the penalties for going over that number harsh. The penalty for carrying more than 14 clubs is two strokes per hole with a maximum penalty of four strokes. You can pretty much carry whatever combination of clubs you like, just not more than 14.

2. Teeing Area

The teeing area is between the two tee markers and up to two club-lengths behind the tee markers. The ball must be teed up in this area. If a player tees off outside the teeing area, the stroke does not count and the player incurs a 2 stroke penalty. However, you can take your stance outside the teeing area.

3. Search Time for a Lost Ball

Search time was reduced from five minutes to three minutes in 2019. The three minutes starts when you get to the search area where the ball is believed to be.

4. Impediments

You must play the ball as it lies. However, if your ball is surrounded by loose impediments, you can move the impediments (things like twigs, stones, leaves, etc.). But if your ball is moved as a result of moving an impediment-you must put the ball back where it was and incur one penalty stroke.

5. Immovable Obstructions

Fixed, artificial objects such as paved roads and paths or sprinkler heads are immovable obstructions. If your ball is within one of these areas and it interferes with your stance or the line of your swing, you are given free relief. To take relief, place the ball no more than one club-length from the obstruction, no closer to the hole.

6. Play It As It Lies

You must play the ball as it lies even if your ball has found a patch of dirt or a divot.

THIS IS OUR GOLF COURSE

This is our golf course, let's take care of it!

- Pairing up in carts is strongly recommended. We are already seeing wear and tear around some of our greens.
- Be mindful of the rope placements around our greens.
- Repair divots in the fairways by keeping plenty of seed in your cart.
- Repair ball marks on the greens, yours plus one more.

A Note from Smitty...



Welcome, to December and the Holidays in the Desert. Cool mornings and mid 60's days are the norm. This is why we go to 9 am and 1 pm shotgun times for December, January and February. What happens to the Golf Ball when the temperatures drop? Answer: It goes shorter. Those of us that live here year round know this. As an example, the

12th hole here at Sunrise. In May, I would hit a 9 iron to the middle of the green, in December, I probably have to use a 8-iron to hit the middle of the green. Another thing that all of us year round residents see is that the ball does not roll this time of year. The Ryegrass is immature and usually longer with a softer floor than the Summertime Bermuda grass. If you have an adjustable driver, set it to the most lofted setting possible this time of year. When we get to mid-March, return the setting back down in loft to allow for the ball rolling more in the fairways. This should help people understand why they don't hit the ball the same distance off the tee in cooler and softer conditions.

GOLF SHOP MERCHANDISE



New Golf Rules...

Rule 1.a.5 - A ball sliced or hooked into the Rough shall be lifted and placed on the Fairway at a point equal to the distance it carried or rolled into the Rough with no penalty. The senior player should not be penalized for tall grass which ground keepers failed to mow.
