Janet Koster's Interview of Ron Cressy

The Wearin' O the Greens

An interview with Golf Superintendent Ron Cressy by Janet Koster, Niners Coordinator

One of the oldest myths in golf information at Sunrise is that all putts break toward Indio. And while he neither confirmed nor denied that, Sunrise Golf Superintendent Ron Cressy does underscore that mowing height and frequency are essential elements in keeping our putting greens in great shape throughout the season. In fact, the greens at Sunrise are mowed seven days per week. Additionally, fertilization, irrigation, grass type and grooming - like using a planned, systematic tee marker and cup rotation pattern – are all factors that he and his team consider to maintain healthy putting greens with adequate speed.

Traffic intensity during peak season also causes major stress on greens including tearing of the sod, abrasion damage, and not to mention, the dreaded ball marks. Cressy notes that ball marks can take up to three weeks to heal if not repaired whereas a well repaired ball mark can heal in a week or less. Add to that, golf industry reports suggest that the average golfer leaves 8-12 ball marks during a typical round of golf.

That's a LOT of ball marks!!

Taking that into consideration, Ron Cressy suggests three easy steps to repair ball marks:

Insert the prongs of your ball mark repair tool (you can pick this complimentary tool up before you play) into the turf at the edge of the depression. Make sure you do not insert the prongs in the depression itself, but around the edges.

Using a "gentle twisting motion", push the edge of the ball mark toward the center using your tool. Make sure not to use the tool at an angle, putting the prongs beneath the center of the depression. This will only tear the roots and kill the grass.

Once you've done steps 1 and 2, smooth the surface with either your club or your foot. When you are satisfied and it looks like a surface you would putt over, you are finished.

Rules of Golf by Pat Snyder

Rule 1.2 speaks to the conduct expected of players. The rule specifically states that players are to play in the spirit of the game by acting with integrity, apply penalties when a rule is breached, and being honest in all aspects of play. Further, players are expected to show consideration for others by playing at a reasonable pace, not distracting others, and *consider others safety*. And finally, care for the course by repairing ball marks, rake bunker, and not cause undue damage.

On our little golf course it is especially important that we allow the group in front of us to fully clear the green before hitting our approach shot. There are cart paths next to all greens conceivably allowing an errant shot to pitch forward into the group departing the green.

Please allow the group in front of you to clear the green before hitting your shot towards the green.

I know this sounds redundant but we have a busy month planned at Sunrise for March. I know other parts of Tee Time Newsletter will devote time to events for March, so I will not take up time discussing the March LGA Events.

Did you know that Sunrise CC has averaged 24,000 rounds played annually

over the last two years? Just slightly busier than our neighboring courses.

The USGA RULES OF GOLF APP is something that is extremely helpful and can settle issues on the course within seconds. I would suggest if you carry your phone with you during golf (whether it is on or not), you have the app downloaded onto your phone. The very first thing that comes up is a map of the areas of the golf course. By clicking on one of the areas of the golf course, you can start the process of finding the correct ruling for the situation your in. As you scroll down, it will give you rules that associate with the area of the course you clicked on.

I would begin by looking this one up, CAN YOU TAKE UNPLAYABLE LIE RELIEF WITH A PENAL-TY IN THE BUNKER? See Rule 19.3 and scroll down to the diagram. Might come in handy in a Stroke Play event.
